RSVP Volunteer Program

We will match you with your perfect volunteer opportunity! RSVP partners with about 60 community agencies and has over 160 jobs. Use your skills gained over the years or develop new ones. It is up to you! As an RSVP Volunteer, you will also have personalized service and flexible scheduling. Opportunities include building homes with Habitat for Humanity, packing food at the Food Bank, driving for Meals on Wheels, fingerprinting for the police and many more.

Foster Grandparents

Make a difference as a classroom mentor for Missoula County students.

Senior Companions

Help older adults and adults with disabilities live independently by supporting them with companionship, encouragement, awareness, appointments and transportation.

As a Senior Corps Volunteer, you will receive free excess insurance while volunteering.

Foster Grandparents & Senior Companions are income eligible seniors who receive a tax-free stipend for 15 hours of service a week.

They also receive reimbursement for mileage.
